# Town of Bernardston Awarded \$74K for Police & Fire Radio Repeaters



Blythe Robinson, Capital Strategic Solutions Senior Project Manager assisted the Town of Bernardston in applying for an Emergency Rural Health Care (ERHC) grant from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The USDA awarded \$74,411 through the ERHC grant for the purchase and installation of nine (9) radio repeaters which will be installed in the Town's police cruisers and fire trucks.

#### Safer Schools

The Commonwealth has announced a local equipment and technology supplemental grant opportunity to assist public schools and local municipalities with enhancing security for the safety of students and staff. Priority for the \$2,910,000 will go to applicants who demonstrate the greatest need and propose cost effective solutions to close high priority gaps or weaknesses in

school security. Applicants who have not received funding for this purpose in the last five years will be given higher priority. Districts that certify they have a Multi-Hazard School Emergency Evacuation & Response Plan in place are eligible to apply, and they may apply for up to \$50,000 per school and not more than \$150,000 (for three buildings). Grant **applications** are due by February 17th at 4:00 PM.

### Critical Incident Stress Management Grant

The Commonwealth has announced that \$950,000 is available to provide law enforcement agencies with access to critical incident stress management and peer support



programs to address police officer mental wellness and suicide prevention. This is a competitive grant for police departments that employ emergency services providers who are currently certified by the State Peer Support Network or International Critical Incident Stress foundation and who provide crisis intervention services.

An example of an eligible grant activity is hiring therapists/clinicians

to train service providers in techniques to cope with crisis or to provide emergency response to critical incidents. The grant will provide up to four months of funding from March – June 2023. Departments who wish to apply must fill out a **one-page intent to apply** form that must be submitted by February 10th.

## Recycling - there is a grant for that!

The <a href="State Department of Environmental Protection">State Department of Environmental Protection</a> lists seven different grants which: support recycling, composting and source reduction, pay dividends for initiatives you've already started, training and tools to support your programs, microgrants for short-term waste reduction, and grants to businesses to expand their collection of materials. There are various Massachusetts and Federal loan programs to increase the use of recycled products, expand recycling capabilities of businesses, food management grants and others.
